About the Training

The goal of this training is to improve the level of knowledge, communication, and collaboration involved in addressing the criminal gang issue affecting communities throughout the nation. The curriculum is based on current policies and proven practices and strategies in the criminal justice field. The training is a collaborative effort among federal partners. Instruction is provided by experienced practitioners and subject-matter experts at no cost to attendees. This training was developed in accordance with the U.S. Department of Justice Initiative for Safer Communities to deliver comprehensive anti-gang training that addresses prevention, enforcement, and prisoner reentry issues for state and local law enforcement and related partner organizations.

Because all levels of criminal justice have an important role in gang prevention, the Project Safe Neighborhoods Anti-Gang Training Conference is tailored to address concerns of criminal justice practitioners at multiple levels. Various tracks of training have been designed to address these specific needs (*for additional information regarding these tracks, please see the reverse side*).

Training Format and Tracks

Conference check-in for all of the tracks will begin at 7:00 a.m. on October 4.

Line Law Enforcement Track (1 day):

Designed to provide attendees with information to address relevant gang issues. Presentations include *Gang Violence Briefing: National and Regional Gang Trends*, and *Characteristics of Armed Gang Members*. Enrollment is limited to sworn law enforcement, probation/parole, and corrections officers. (Note: Law enforcement officers who want additional training should register for the Investigators and Prosecutors Track. See below for details.)

Investigators and Prosecutors Track (3 days):

Designed to enable attendees to explore gang topics in depth. Presentations include *Working With Cooperating Witnesses and Confidential Informants*, *Overview of Investigative Tools*, and *Gang Prosecution: Charging Tools*. Enrollment is limited to prosecutors and sworn law enforcement, probation/parole, and corrections officers.

Intervention and Prevention Track (3 days):
